WHERE DO I PUT THE DEBRIS?

Residents should separate their debris and place it in their front yard, NOT on the curbside and NOT in the road. When cleanup crews are dispatched to your area to collect certain types of debris, you will be asked to move those piles to the edge of the road. Until then, roadway edges must remain clear while VDOT crews are clearing roads.

HOW DO I GET HELP CLEANING UP?
