ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT DEBRIS REMOVAL FORM FEMA-4831-DR-VA

On October 1, 2024, a Presidential Disaster, referenced as FEMA-DR-4831-VA, was declared as a result of Tropical Storm Helene. FEMA is committed to assisting communities through the integration of emergency response activities in accordance with federal laws and executive orders. Please fill out the following form in order to assess any impacts within sensitive habitats, such as forested areas, rivers and streams. More information on sensitive habitats as they relate to threatened and endangered species at (<u>https://ipac.ecosphere.fws.gov/</u>). Care should be taken in these types of areas where the following best management practices (BMPs) would apply:

- Limit the removal of standing trees to the greatest extent practicable.
- Minimize instream work to the greatest extent practicable.
- Photograph areas before and after debris removal activities occur if the above two BMPs are not practicable and include with this form.

This process applies to emergency debris removal activities occurring within **120** days of the event. Activities taking place **after January 25, 2025**, should follow standard compliance processes, which include consulting FEMA Environmental and Historic Preservation prior to the start of work to obtain site specific guidance.
